

## Income

The Income section includes funding received from both government and non-government sources during FY2004. Library per capita income from the city is included. (The per capita income is figured by taking the library's income from the city and dividing it by the population of the city.) The library's total income per capita is also included.

## Expenditures

The Expenditures section includes spending for library operations in various categories such as salaries and other staff costs, books and other materials, and other expenditures, such as supplies and plant operations. The amount spent per capita is also listed.

## Collections

The Collections section lists the number of total items available for use as of June 30, 2004, including print and audio visual materials. The number of items added and withdrawn during the year is also listed.

## Circulation

The Circulation section lists the number of times various types of library materials were checked out to library customers. The number of circulations per capita is also listed, as is interlibrary loan activity: the number of items loaned to other libraries (ILL Provided) and borrowed from other libraries (ILL Received)

## Other
