Edge is led by the Urban Libraries Council and developed by a national coalition of leading library and local government organizations with support from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. This groundbreaking tool was developed to help libraries assess their technology, communicate its impact, and plan for the future. Libraries of all sizes are successfully using Edge to strengthen and improve their technology services.

ASSESS. COMMUNICATE. ACHIEVE.

Now there's a management tool that can help libraries align their technology services to the needs of the community. That tool is Edge. Edge guides libraries to set measurable, strategic goals for digital inclusion and to engage government and community leaders in meaningful discussion about technology needs and plans.

Edge is a four-step, resource-rich toolkit that helps library leaders wisely make technology improvement decisions.

STEP 1 — ASSESS

Take an online assessment to identify strengths, gaps, and areas of improvement for technology infrastructure and services. Criteria are based on 11 national benchmarks that gauge community value, stakeholder engagement, and organizational management.

STEP 2 — PLAN

Review assessment data and select recommendations to create an Action Plan.

STEP 3 — IMPLEMENT

Use the Action Plan as a roadmap to strengthen technology services to meet community priorities.

STEP 4 — COMMUNICATE

Engage local leaders and communicate how library technology supports community priorities.

The Library as Technology Leader

With the Edge Toolkit, libraries create a roadmap for strengthening and developing technology services to meet the specific priorities of their communities.

- Data-based recommendations to improve technology
